P- 10 CURRICULUM AND STANDARDS

VELS Overview

The Prep to Year 10 curriculum for all Victorian schools is contained in the VELS. It is important for teachers to understand the rationale behind the VELS, its structure including the three learning strands, domains and dimensions. These are outlined in the VELS Overview.

Prep to Year 10 Standards

The standards for each domain include:

- an introduction
- a description of the structure of the domain
- learning focus statements
- standards for what students should know and be able to do at each level.

Standards for student achievement are set at six levels over the 11 years of compulsory schooling. The standards are introduced when developmentally appropriate for students so are not written for the six levels in all domains.

ASSESSING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Standards and Progression Points

The standards are used by teachers as the basis for assessing student achievement. These show the progression of student knowledge and achievement through the six levels.

Progression points are provided as examples of student progress between the standards. These are examples only and do not cover every element of a standard. Teachers and schools can use these as a reference point for writing their own examples.

Teachers then make on-balance, holistic judgments about student progress using the standards and progression point examples.
