Research

For each car you selected for Task 2, find out the costs associated with the following:

- purchase price
- registration fee
- compulsory third party insurance
- delivery charges
- stamp duty
- transfer of registration fee
- number plate fee
- vehicle inspection and/or road worthy certificate
- depreciation
- vehicle insurance
- regular servicing, maintenance and repair costs over 12 months and 3 years
- fuel (assume that you will drive 10,000kms/year)
- loan establishment and interest costs
- roadside assistance
- any other costs relevant to the cars you have selected, for example, adding additional features.
